FILES PETITION . . . Los Angeles County's 376,337 signatures bring total up to 492,537 petitioners for Senate Reapportionment, as Supervisor Frank G. Bonelli files petitions with County Registrar Benjamin S. Ite on Monday for validation of voters' signatures. Hite's office will work in three shifts to process these petitions, while Bonelli's Senate Reapportionment Committee conducts intensive final 10-day drive for 100,000 additional signatures to compensate for anticipated 25 per cent errors and assure the 420,462 validated signatures necessary for qualifying the measure for November ballot.

Largest Confirmation Class Scheduled Friday

The largest Confirmation Class in the history of Temple Menorah of the South Bay will conduct the Shovuos (Feast of Weeks — Pentecost) Services on Friday at 4 o'clock. The Confirmands also will pledge a Declaration of Faith and read from the Holy Scriptures as part of the liturgy to be conducted in the Temple building at 1101 Camino Real, Redondo Beach.

The 24 students, who are being graduated from their 11-year-long studies of Judaism at the Temple Religious School, will deliver speeches on the various Books of the Bible as proof of their competence in Jewish studies.

BESIDES receiving gifts of Bibles and Prayer Books from the Sisterhood and Brotherhood, the young people will receive special certificates of Confirmation from the South Bay's oldest and largest Jewish Religious Congregation.

The class of 1962 is presenting two new Torah covers for the Sacred Scrolls of the Law.

A reception in honor of the Confirmands will follow at the

conclusion of the Service. The public is invited to witness this special service.

CONFIRMATION is held on Shovuos because that is the traditional date when Moses received the Ten Commandments from God on Mount Sinai. There is a tradition in Judaism that the young people in every generation are pledged to study and observe the Laws of God as proof of the faith of the Jewish people in The One God. Shovuos is the holiday selected by Reform Judaism for Confirmation since it is the holiday most in keeping with the concept of vowing and pledging oneself to the ethical monotheism which is Judaism.
