(Continued From Page 1) always tell them there is no secret involved and they are welcome to watch as long as they want," he said.

Boyce said he has never heard of a device which effectively jams a police radar unit.

"It might be possible but you would have to have several thousand dollars worth of equipment in your car," he said.

HE ADDED, "There is an electronic device on the market which feels out the radar beam and gives a beep once the car comes within the beam but by that time speed of the car has already been recorded by the radar unit."

Operation of the radar unit is not difficult. "Anyone of

you with a short instruction period could operate it," he said.

"We hope to have a second radar unit soon. Our problem is manpower to operate it. It takes an operator and several motorcycle officers to effectively operate it," he added.

SPEED OF vehicles is recorded on a graph and on a visual meter. The device is operated by a large bus battery and the radar unit's motor is not running when the device is being used.

The beam is projected through a hole covered with fiber glass in rear of the sedan, Boyce explained. Since police radio frequencies are often congested, the radar officer communicates with the motorcycle officers through speakers mounted in front of the radar unit.

The radar device has its limitations, Boyce said, since it will not tell which vehicle is exceeding the limit so the operator views the vehicles as they pass through the radar beam, and watches their speed being recorded.

## Dean Wins Scholarship

Dr. John A. Grasham, dean of instruction at Harbor College, has been named as a winner of a Fulbright Scholarship to teach in Italy.

Dean Grasham will sail for Naples from New York Aug. 8 on the SS Constitution. Accompanying him will be his wife and five children. Before being assigned to an Italian school or university, Dean Grasham will take a language and indoctrination course at Peshiera sul Garda in Northern Italy.

In his new assignment he will teach English classes, give lectures about America and

Italian teachers in the teaching of English.

Dean Grasham, who lives at 15358 Cohasset St., Van Nuys, holds an A.B. degree from Arizona State College and M. A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of Southern California. He has been active in speech and forensic work and is the author of a textbook, "Improving Your Speech," which was published in 1960. He has had an interest in magic and magicians and has been president of the Hollywood Ring International Brotherhood of Magicians. He joined

the Harbor administration in 1958.

(Continued From Page 1) equipment. We are a cause for divorce when the youngsters get married—husbands cannot afford us."

After the regular business Mrs. Dorothy Corowin, a former school teacher, criticized and suggested improvements on the grading cards used in the Torrance district.

MRS. COROWIN gave six suggestions after studying report cards from other districts. 1. Cards should have a statement of district policy on them.

Subjects should be broken into components for grading.

3. There should be a place included for teacher comment.

4. Citizenship should be broken into components for grading. Such things as character growth are too involved to be lumped under one heading.

5. There should be a different type of grading for primary grades where IQ or standardized tests are not given. (Standardized tests begin in the third grade.)

6. The basis for grading should be carefully considered.

DR. SHERY attacked Mrs. Corowin's fifth suggestion, saying she placed too much emphasis on the standardized tests.

Mrs. Corowin replied, "they have their place or they would not be given."

Regarding the sixth point, Mrs. Corowin said, "the Torrance policy was vague," and "not a very clear statement."

"The Torrance policy reads 'students are graded on academic achievement in relation to the rest of the class.'"


