

Seven Area Osteopaths Get Degrees

Seven Torrance residents will be among nearly 2,000 practicing osteopaths who will receive Doctor of Medicine degrees from the College of Medicine in historic ceremonies this weekend in Los Angeles. The seven are part of what is believed to be the largest doctorate class in medical history. The mass graduation and conferment of M. D. degrees will mark the latest step taken toward the unification of California's doctors of medicine and doctors of osteopathy. Clyde J. Barnes, Allan T. Brown, James S. Burrell, Theodore C. Buzanis, Donald G. Cortum, Duane E. Ewers and Hampton L. Fancher Jr. will receive their M.D.s in ceremonies Saturday and Sunday. California voters will have an opportunity to vote on the union in the November elec-

tion. The unification is presented to the voters in Proposition 22 on the general ballot.

Six Camino Students Get Scholarships

Six El Camino students are recipients of scholarships from three universities and the state of California, Merl F. Sloan, college director of student personnel, announced at the June awards banquet.

Winners of scholarship grants from the University of California are Rudolph Johnson, Torrance, and Jim Masuda, Gardena.

Mason Wolpert, also of Torrance, holds a \$1,000 per year award to the University of Miami, Florida. Wayne Overbeck, Manhattan Beach, is the recipient of a journalism scholarship to the University of Southern California.

Winners of California State scholarships are Johnson, Overbeck, Norman Michelson, Gardena, and Rosalind Zehra, Hawthorne.

STATE scholarships are applicable toward tuition and fees at any accredited four-year college or university in California, and provide a maximum of \$900 per year, renewable for four years.

Winners of state awards are chosen on a basis of scores on the Scholastic Aptitude Test, past academic record, and financial need.

Johnson, a pre-med major at ECC, will transfer to the Berkeley campus of the University of California in September. A 1960 graduate of Hawthorne High School, Johnson was valedictorian of his class.

In addition to the two scholarship grants, Johnson received a special scholastic award at ECC in the field of physical sciences.

WOLPERT is a '60 graduate of North High School, where he was student body president. He was active in forensics activities at ECC, winning a series of awards.

Masuda, a political science major at El Camino, plans to transfer to UCLA in the fall. He has been active, along with Wolpert, in the campus forensics program.

Overbeck will transfer to USC in the fall, majoring in journalism. He was a graduate of Mira Costa High School in 1960.

Active in student government and journalism at El Camino, Overbeck held the post of commissioner of publications for three semesters, and has received several awards in journalism.

County Funds Allocated to Palos Verdes

A total of \$805,000 is slated for major road improvements in the Palos Verdes area under Los Angeles County road fund allocations during the fiscal year.

The projects will be made available from county funds under a \$40 million budget for fiscal 1962-63.

In announcing the fund allocation, Supervisor Burton W. Chace also commented on several scheduled projects. Among the streets to be improved are Hawthorne Boulevard from Newton Street to Palos Verdes Drive North, and Highridge Road from Hawthorne Boulevard to Crest Road.

Also to be improved is a 1.2-mile section of Hawthorne Boulevard from Crest Road to Palos Verdes Drive West.
