

Kegs Oppose Gardena Recreation Champs

Rapidly running out of competition, the Tappa Kegs will move into Thornberg Park tomorrow night for a practice slo-pitch game against the Gardena Recreation League champs, the Chevrons.

Gardena will have to field a powerful unit — only one defeat has marred the Tappa Kegga record in their last 61 encounters.

The Kegs swept through the West Coast Slo-Pitch League with little difficulty, experiencing only one defeat in 20 contests. Fittingly enough, it was another Gardena team, the Bulls, who handed the Kegs their sole licking.

Four sluggers over the .400 mark will power the Kegga offense.

CHUCK Schoendienst (.516), Gib Matthews (.451), Bill Morris (.438), and Ray Magnante (.435) will supply the Tappa power.

Magnante has 24 RBIs to his credit and Dick Stutz and Matthews have clubbed three home runs apiece.

OVERALL, the Tappa Kegs hit at a team clip of .370 for the West Coast League campaign.

Pitching is another Keg forte.

Chuck Ryan has amassed an 11-0 record to lead the Kegga mound crew. Backing Ryan up are Bryan Stephens with a 5-1 mark and Schoendienst with a 3-0 record. The trio have combined to twirl eight shutouts this year.

THEY HAVE allowed opponents only 49 runs, while their teammates have collected 157 tallies.

Gardena will not be able to depend on sloppy Tappa Kegga fielding. The Torrance club is led by Bill Echols with a .989 fielding average and has fielded at a .939 clip.
