Prayer Ban to Mark Local Campaign Talk

The controversial Supreme Court ruling outlawing prayers in public schools will become a key issue in the 17th Congressional District campaign, according to GOP nominee Ted Bruinsma.

Bruinsma assailed the recent court ruling as "another indication of the worsening Washington climate where every day sees another reckless chop at the basic principles which our nation must observe in order to survive."

"I see only disaster for America if the men in Washington continue to destroy our nation's moral foundation. No wonder we have our Billie Solis and the multi-million dollar scandals with the taxpayers' money."

"This nation grew to greatness under the principle 'In God We Trust.' Now we are asked to place that trust in mere Washington mortals who daily show that they do not trust the average American to conduct his own life, his family, his business, his budget."

Bruinsma said "too many attacks on America are now underway by the proponents of statism. We have seen in recent weeks how they want to destroy the law-making balance that preserves our liberties by taking the tax power from Congress and giving it to one man in the White House. We have seen the attacks on patriotism. We have seen straight-faced assertions that debt is not a debt and deficits are not deficits."
