Each year across the nation, many pedestrians are killed in traffic accidents. Most people do not give any thought to the safety of pedestrians, but it is as important as the safety of the city's drivers.

Pedestrians have as much right to walk on certain portions of the highway as drivers have to move vehicles on the same roadway. As a driver, you are in a position to control your speed and driving habits, and drivers must be careful where pedestrians are using the highways.

PEDESTRIANS are subject to certain rules, also. They should be aware of their obligations.

Watch for pedestrians on the roadway ahead of you at all times. Pedestrians are governed by many laws and ordinances which prohibit "jaywalking." Among them are the following:

1. Pedestrians must yield the right-of-way to vehicles when crossing the roadway at places other than intersections or marked crosswalks. But any driver is still required to take care for the safety of any pedestrian. (VC Sec. 21964)

2. BETWEEN controlled intersections pedestrians may cross only in crosswalks. (VC Sec. 21955)

3. A pedestrian walking on a roadway shall walk on the left side. Where there are no sidewalks, his safest position is facing the traffic moving toward him. Another good safety rule is for the pedestrian to carry something white so as to be more readily seen at night. (VC Sec. 21956)

4. Pedestrians must comply with traffic control signals at all times. Any pedestrian who has partly completed a crossing when a signal changes, shall proceed to a sidewalk, safety zone, or island until the signal permits him to go on. (VC Sec. 21456)

A pedestrian must yield the right-of-way to any vehicle still lawfully in an intersection

at the time a signal first changes to green or "go" for the pedestrian. (VC Sec. 21451)

5. AT intersections where traffic is not controlled by signals, the pedestrian has the right-of-way within any marked or unmarked crosswalk. (VC Sec. 21950)

6. Pedestrians are not permitted upon any toll bridge or highway crossing unless a sidewalk more than three feet wide is provided, and signs indicate that pedestrians are permitted to use it. A pedestrian who enters any portion of such a structure not intended for public use is guilty of a misdemeanor. (VC Secs. 23331 and 23332)

No pedestrian should ever leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that it is impossible for the driver to stop.

Maren Courtney, 5451 Sharyne Lane, is serving this week as a crafts counselor at the 13th annual Troy Camp for children eight to 12 years of age.


The camp is operated at Idyllwild by USC students.
