

Congregation Ner Tamid Schedules Rosh Hashanah

Scherich School Parents Hold Session With Staff

Parents of children enrolled in Scherich South Bay School, educational facility for youngsters with learning problems, met Friday for the first parent-teachers' meeting of the fall term.

Gathered at the school at 1103 Tullia Ave., Redondo Beach, parents heard teachers Barbara Wilcox, Helen Spencer, and Warren Scherich discuss the perceptual training each student receives.

Scherich, who also summarized the school's calendar for the year, explained how reading is taught to children with

both visual and auditory perceptions. Special techniques are needed, he said, for children who cannot learn with conventional teaching methods.

PARENTS were then asked to list five questions which they had when they realized their children had learning problems. These queries, along with answers, will be given new parents who come to the school for help, Scherich said.

Scherich also emphasized the importance of re-educating parents when their children

are faced with learning problems. He pointed out that through meetings such as last week's, parents can learn to help youngsters resolve such problems at home, thereby returning them to regular classrooms.

IN JUST this way, he added, many discipline problems also are corrected and learning difficulties improved.

Many emotional and highly excitable children have found the additional help offered by the school the answer to stay-

ing up with their classes and groups, Scherich said.

Classes at Scherich South Bay School are given for all grade levels through high school in all studies.

Study sessions are now being held each Saturday from 10 a.m. to noon for all grades of reading.

Beth El, 1435 W. 7th St., San Pedro.

GREETING THE New Year 5723 (since Genesis) the traditional "Shofar" (Ram's Horn) will on these days call worshippers to appear before their Lord and Maker on this "Day of Judgment." In prayer they will account for their actions of the past, seek forgiveness for their transgressions, and supplicate God for another year of life.

Life is one of the central themes of the liturgy of the High Holy Days for Jews. "Remember us unto Life, O

King, who delightest in life, inscribe us in the Book of Life, so that we may live worthily for Thy sake, O God of Life."

With the prayer for Life, the High Holy Day season opens the "Ten Days of Penitence" on Rosh Hashanah which culminates on the 10th day of the observance of Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement.

YOM KIPPUR services will begin this year on Sunday, Oct. 7, at sundown with the chanting of the celebrated "Kol Nidre."

Complete abstinence from food or drink of any kind and

continuous prayer ending at sundown of the following day complete the cycle of the Jews' search and prayer for atonement and forgiveness.

During these solemn days, Jews offer one another as greeting, the wish: "May you be inscribed for a good year, a sweet year of life and peace."


