

Southland Tops Business Levels During September

Southern California's economy reached a new record in the overall level of business activity during September, H. P. Atherton Jr., manager of Security First National Bank's Torrance branch, reported today.

Based on the latest data available, the local economy presently is running at more than 10 per cent above last year's level.

The September advance is a

continuation of the upward trend which started in last year's fourth quarter, Atherton said.

The strongest economic factors in September's business picture include an unusually large volume of retail trade and, normal seasonal factors considered, a high level of building and real estate activity.

ONE OF THE major forces

sustaining the Southland's economy this year has been the building and construction industry.

Volume of construction recorded has been at a consistently high level each month, hitting a record high last May. It appears certain that construction activity is heading for a new record in 1962 for the 11th consecutive year.

According to the bank's report, volume is expected to reach \$3.8 billion, or 3 1/2 per cent more than last year.

In general, Southern California's tempo of business activity is paralleling national trends with only minor variations.

During the past twelve months, total employment in the 14 southern-most counties has shown a gain of 3 1/2 per cent. This compares with a nationwide increase of just under 2 per cent.

Man Blames Ill Health, Takes Life


A 56-year-old Torrance man committed suicide Sunday night by hanging himself from a utility pole near 212th Street and Torrance Boulevard.

Richard Louis Cadwallader, who resided at 1860 Torrance Blvd., left a note in his coat pocket which stated his time of death was 10 p.m. Sunday and that he was in ill health.

The body was found about 7:25 a.m. Monday. His body was found hanging from the pole, about 128 feet from 212th Street and in a vacant field southeast of 1830 Torrance Blvd. His left leg was clearing the ground by about three inches. A four foot step-ladder was leaning against the pole.

The body was taken to Halverson-Leavel Mortuary.
