

# West Moves Up in Grid World With Tie

Inspired by a 7-7 tie with Barstow in its last outing, West High again sets an eye toward its first football victory in history Saturday night at 8 against Palmdale.

The game will be played on the North High gridiron.

Winless and scoreless in three straight games, the Warriors bounced back against

Barstow, and were on the visitors' two-yard stripe when the final gun went off.

The first West touchdown in history came as sophomore halfback Allan Thomas, concluding a 60-yard march, smashed five yards off tackle into the promised land.

Senior fullback Miles Moore tried the same off tackle slot

for the conversion.

Head West coach Parton credited his team with making "less mistakes," and "stopping Barstow's running game cold."

Parton did point out that his team's pass defense still needed work.

Parton felt his team should have beat Barstow, and optimistically looks forward to

Saturday, saying, "I believe this will be one of our best chances to win a game all year."

Palmdale runs from a tight Wing-T, stressing the running game. Although the invaders throw usually no more than 10 times a game, the Warrior coach credits them with a fine passer and a good receiver.
