

## A Closer Look

**HOLLYWOOD** — Although lacking the dramatic impact of the Great Debates of 1960, television has played a responsible and worthwhile role in presenting to the public many of the issues and candidates in the recent political campaigns. For this TV stations deserve due credit.

Where both radio and TV fail to perform the ultimate public service during campaigns, however, results from the limiting provisions of the Federal Communications Act of 1934, and more specifically from the famed "equal time" clause.

Section 315 of the Federal Communications Act provides that, "if any licensee shall permit any person who is a legally qualified candidate for any public office to use a broadcasting station, he shall afford equal opportunity to all other such candidates for that office..." It's also important to note that this same provision states that, "No obligation is imposed upon any licensee to allow the use of its station by any such candidate."

**BROADCASTERS** are pressing hard for either repeal or substantial revision of this clause, and efforts will be accelerated when the new Congress convenes in January, the hope being that major and permanent changes can be voted prior to the Presidential elections in 1964.

The original intent of the rule was to insure that broadcasters would not exploit their franchise to use the public air waves to influence political elections. Today the industry defends its drive for repeal of Section 315 on the basis of the high degree of public responsibility it has shown in election campaigns during the intervening years, and especially in 1960 when the limitation was waived in connection with the Presidential and Vice Presidential candidates.
