 Angeles County's plan is the best fallout shelter program in the nation, but "lack of supporting public opinion and funds from Washington have stymied its construction."

"IT PROVIDES a practical solution to Los Angeles County's need, outlining the establishment of shelter within 15 minutes walking distance of the majority of the population's homes," he added.
 The shelters will be multi-purpose.

Designed for construction under schools, they may be used as auxiliary classrooms, gymnasiums, cafeterias and meeting areas.
 California's growing population has created an alarming shortage of educational facilities and shelter-classes could help meet that problem.
 COUNTY ENGINEER John Lambie, working with Roy Hoover, director of disaster services for the county, has prepared plans for five prototype shelters as key sites.

They are at Hollywood High School, Dana Junior High School in Arcadia, Birney Elementary School in Long Beach, Antelope Valley Junior College and Southwest Sportsman's Park, 98th Street and Western Avenue.
 Plans provide for shelters to be built with a floor area of 10 square feet per person, with enough stored water for one gallon per day per person, with a minimum ceiling height of eight feet and a maximum controlled temperature of 85 degrees.

IT WOULD cost approximately \$400 million to install shelters under every school ground in the county, Hahn said.
 "In 1952 and 1958, Los Angeles County voters approved bond issues totaling \$400 million to build storm drains," he noted. "Certainly a like price is not too high to pay for protection."
 Hahn has hammered hard for fallout shelters since it first became evident that the Soviet Union was bent in world domination and that the horrors of nuclear warfare could

be a reality and not just a bad dream.
 HE HAS constantly emphasized that the place for shelters is not in the Civic Center, which is virtually deserted after 6 p.m. and on weekends. "It is in the communities that the great concentration of population is found," he said. "It is in the communities that schools have strategically been placed to serve the population, and where children and adults alike can find refuge near their homes."

"Public interest in fallout shelters rises and falls in direct proportion to the international situation," the supervisor observed. "It was at its peak during the Berlin crisis."
 "NOW WE ARE faced with another, even more serious crisis, in which our own population is directly threatened by an island military installation only a few miles off our mainland.
 "Let us hope this crisis, too, passes. Then the fallout shelters we would build could

serve as peacetime facilities to augment our school classrooms.
 But if this latest threat to the United States' well being and security cannot be resolved peacefully, then let us be prepared," Hahn concluded.
 Direct supervision of 400 school crossing guards in various sections of California is a function of the California Highway Patrol.
