

November Totals Shows Business At Near Record

Paced by a strong demand, Southern California's business activity in November continued to perform at the near-record level which has prevailed in recent months, Hedley P. Atherton Jr., manager of Security First National Bank's Torrance branch, reported yesterday.

According to Atherton, leading elements of the local economy include department store sales, bank clearings and real estate activity.

Building and construction activity also was at a high rate during November, although it was slightly below the October level, he said.

BASED ON figures for the week ending Nov. 23, Security Bank's business index stood at 124.3 (preliminary), compared to the like year-ago period reading of 117.8.

One of the major factors of weakness in the Southern California business scene continues to be unemployment, bank's report noted.

For the 14-county area, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate has risen from 5.2 per cent at the beginning of the year to 6.3 per cent in September and six per cent in October.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT rate for the entire nation declined in the early part of 1962 to a low of 5.2 per cent and climbed to 5.8 per cent in September, the latest month available, Security said.

In the Los Angeles - Long Beach metropolitan area, the unemployment rate dropped from 5.6 per cent in February to 5.2 per cent in June. It since has climbed to 5.5 per cent.

San Diego County's seasonally adjusted rate was 6.7 per cent in January. It rose to 9.1 per cent in June and declined to eight per cent in October.

Security's researchers pointed out that in the San Bernardino - Riverside area the rate has remained close to six per cent throughout most months of the current year.
