## Council Briefs

The City Council, meeting at 8 p.m. Tuesday, Dec. 11, took the following action:

Approved final tract map submitted by Kenland Development Co. for 37 lots west of Ocean Avenue and north of 229th Street.

Denied the request of a Los Angeles legal firm for permission to use the city hall conference room for an arbitration hearing unless the firm could show such use would be in the public interest. It was indicated that the hearing was possibly a private matter.

Denied request of Bayer-Klein Construction Co. for waiver of requirement to pay sewer revolving fund and sewer use fees on property at 319 Palos Verdes Blvd.

**ACCEPTED FOUR** street easements and two sanitary sewer easements presented by City Engineer Walter M. Nollac.

Accepted easements from Chanslor-Western Oil & Development Co. to permit widening of northwesterly corner of Crenshaw and Sepulveda.

Approved partial refund of fee for unused building permit issued to Spraker & Halstead on recommendation of Building Inspector Lee Schless.

**CONCURRED** with recommendation of city's billboard committee to approve erection of three billboards for Certi-Bond at Crenshaw and 190th Street, Arlington and 190th Street, and Arlington and Artesia.

Denied recommendation that speed limit on Anza Avenue and Calle Mayor south of Sepulveda be raised from 25 mph to 30 mph, and asked for resolution to remove the two streets from the city's truck route streets. A commit-

tee of city and area residents was formed to study traffic problems in the area.

Approved recommendation of Traffic Engineer James Whitmer to install left-turn pockets on Crenshaw Boulevard at Carson Street and at Torrance Boulevard. Construction will not be started until after next Jan. 1, Whitmer told the councilmen.

**APPROVED** purchase of fire department equipment including four nozzles, one aerial intercom, and refrigerators for two fire stations.

**ADOPTED** resolution authorizing "No Parking at Any Time" posting on the south side of Pacific Coast Highway from Avenue I to Paseo de las Delicias.

Adopted resolution authorizing installation of stop signs on 218th Street at both approaches to Martina Avenue.

**ACCEPTED** donation of \$200 from Dog Obedience Club of Torrance for recreation improvement and approved an agreement to use the funds to purchase two bench swings and a traveling puppet stage for the city's park equipment.

Accepted and filed report of the Rev. H. M. Sippel, chairman of the Parks and Recreation Commission, indicating that development of Victor Park near West High School was now under way.

Referred report on Little League ball diamonds in Seaside Sump of City Manager Wade Peebles for study.

**DETERMINED** after discussion not to comment officially on recommendation of Commission for Good Literary Standards and Juvenile Welfare that the Commission "be on record that they do not consider the showing of the motion picture, 'Poor White Trash,' within the boundaries

of the city of Torrance in the best interest of youth residing in this community." City Attorney Stanley Remelmeyer warned the City Council that the legal problems involved were complicated, and that it was his opinion that the councilmen "should stay out of movie censorship."

Approved request of member of Commission for Good Literary Standards and Juvenile Welfare to be absent for three meetings.

**CONCURRED** in recommendation to change name of Commission for Good Literary Standards and Juvenile Welfare to Youth Welfare Commission.

Approved recommendation of City Engineer Nollac to accept proposal of Twining Laboratories for airport soil tests.

Adopted resolution setting up agreement between city and Weldon J. Fulton for architectural services for senior recreation center, Phase 1 of the Joslyn Center.

Approved City Manager Peebles recommendation to replace furniture in the city manager's office including one desk, swivel chair, telephone side stand, and occasional table at a cost of \$677.33.

**AUTHORIZED** attendance of City Manager Peebles at League of California Cities spring meeting of the city managers' department in Monterey, Feb. 13-15.

Approved allocation of \$1,000 to employ James M. Montgomery to make study of water storage capacity with view to enlarging facilities near Crenshaw Boulevard and Rolling Hills Road.

Approved recommendation to acquire parcel of land on Torrance Beach at tax sale by Los Angeles County. (Continued on Page 38)
