Recreation Center Dedication Set

A new, \$175,000 recreation center, first in the projected cultural-recreational complex of Torrance Civic Center, will be dedicated in official ceremonies Tuesday.

Civic officials will join representatives from varying levels of government in heralding completion of the facility, built on property which eventually will include a main library, civic auditorium, gymnasium, senior citizen building and art gallery.

The 10,000 square-foot center, under construction since April, will be utilized widely by civic organizations and other public groups which meet now in makeshift headquarters throughout the city, officials say.

Presented on Tuesday's dedication, scheduled to begin at 2:30 p.m. will be Mayor Albert Isen, city councilmen, Assemblyman Vincent Thomas (D-68th Dist.), a number of representatives from civic organizations, city officials and other dignitaries.

Multi-purpose construction of the center, which includes two entirely separate auditoriums, will offer the advantage of uniquely versatile use, according to Park and Recreation Commission chairman, the Rev. Milton Sippel.

Seating capacity in the main auditorium is 450 with one adjoining area capable of accommodating an additional 225 persons for a total of 675.

Presently under contract on the civic center site is a three-story Superior Court Building directly behind City Hall.
