The House of Sweden, as it is known there, has gained a reputation for itself that would be envied by any establishment in the business. In the 14 months it has been open, the House of Sweden has served more than 150,000 people its delicious smorgasbord lunches and dinners.

NOW THESE two enterprising young men have expanded their services to the Torrance area. The new House of Swe-

den is located in Cravens just north of Merrellina. The same delicious food and authentic Swedish atmosphere is maintained in this restaurant.

Your waitresses are dressed in the costumes of the homeland and the surroundings are typically Swedish.

On three separate occasions I have treated myself to their fine food and I can highly recommend it.

They have one price for lunch and one for dinner, and special diet lunches if you wish. The children, however, will not eat as much as you so the House of Sweden has reduced prices for them.

GAY BLADES hang their skates in the lobby of the Silver Skates combination steak house, coffee shop, and cocktail lounge. They know that ice skating can be just as much fun as a spectator sport as it can be on the ice arena itself, if it's witnessed over the finest of filet mignons.

Silver Skates, adjacent to the Olympic Ice Arena on

Western Avenue, serves up a full menu, 24 hours a day. Its window-wall faces the glacier arena inviting the entertainment of ice pro and amateur—as you dine.

A merchant lunch is served daily from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. A split-level coffee shop insures a full view of the exciting skating sport to every patron.

MANY RESTAURANTS boast of their "home made" pies or salad dressing or any number of individual items on their menus, but very few can boast that everything on their menu

is made right under the roof where it is served.

One such restaurant is in Torrance. Pepe's Pizza Palace is on Carson just east of Western Avenue.

As the name implies, this is an Italian restaurant. Pepe believes in serving the best. He can only do so by preparing everything himself from the sauces used in his ravioli to the dough used to make pizza. Nothing is bought in prepared form.

Well, it seems that all is not lost in the celluloid world. After chastising the producers of the many off-color films that have come out of the glamour city during the past few weeks, I became aware of the many fine films that are being brought back.

It is well to note films such as these since they are a credit to the industry and all concerned.

Movies such as "Seven Brides for Seven Brothers," starring Jane Powell and Howard Keel, "Father of the Bride," with Elizabeth Taylor, Spencer Tracy and Joan Bennett, and many other films are now returning for their second run.
