December Worst Crime Month, Warns Sheriff

"There will be more burglaries, thefts and assaults this month than at any comparable time in modern history!" This was the grim warning issued today by Los Angeles County Sheriff Peter Pitchess.

The month of December is a problem for law enforcement officials all over the United States. In addition to thefts and assaults, traffic accidents increase, both in number and severity; drunk arrests soar; and the trend up-

ward continues year after year.

Pitchess emphasized that residents can protect themselves from most of the hazards of December crime by following three simple rules:

1. Lock your house and windows and leave a light on at night, all night, every night.
2. Lock your car while Christmas shopping. Don't leave packages or valuables in sight. Lock them in the trunk compartment.
3. If you drink, don't drive.
