Punch Recipes Shared By El Camino Teacher

Holiday punch can add a festive glow to any seasonal table, especially if its easy to prepare and the outcome is delicious.

Mrs. Hazel Kuehn, El Camino instructor of home economics, suggests three holiday punch recipes that are

easy to prepare and almost guarantee compliments. The recipes may be served with any Christmas bread, cookie, fruitcake or open-faced sandwich.

The first of the recipes is not only a light, frothy drink but when served, makes a conversation piece.

Holiday Froth Punch

2 cans frozen pineapple-grapefruit juice concentrate, softened
2 cans frozen lemonade concentrate, softened
1 quart club soda, chilled
1 quart gingerale, chilled
2 pints raspberry sherbert ice cubes

Pour softened juice concentrate into punch bowl. Add club soda and gingerale with about 1 quart ice cubes. Stir in raspberry sherbert until well blended.

Set punch bowl in a large roasting pan filled with fern fronds, half fill pan with water. Using tongs (not hands, add 4 chunks of dry ice to the water, not punch. The dry ice added to the water creates a mist which hovers delicately around the bowl and is sure to add not only compliments to the drink, but conversation to the gathering. (Makes 30 servings.)

Sparkling New Years Punch

1 quart cranberry juice, chilled
2 cans (6 oz.) frozen lemonade concentrate
2 cans (6 oz.) frozen orange juice concentrate
1 quart club soda, chilled
2 quarts gingerale, chilled
1 can (46 oz.) pineapple juice, chilled

Combine all ingredients (keep surplus in refrigerator until needed). Makes six quarts.

Garnish punch bowl with a frozen ring of lemonade, made with two extra cans of frozen lemonade concentrate. Freeze concentrate in ring salad mold with garnishes such as mint leaves, red or green cherries, slices of lemon, orange or pineapple to add a festive touch. (Makes 50 servings.)

Wassail Punch—California Style

1 gallon sweet cider
1 (6 oz.) can frozen orange juice concentrate
1 (6 oz.) can frozen lemonade concentrate
1 quart water
1/2 cup sugar
6 whole cloves
3 pieces stick cinnamon
Place spices in a cheese cloth bag. Combine all ingredients in a large container (8 quart pan). Bring just to a boil with cheese cloth bag in it. Remove spices, serve hot in punch bowl. Garnish with thin lemon slices studded with whole cloves. (Makes 40 servings.)
