### Sale of Lomita News To Palos Verdes Told

Purchase of the Lomita News by Palos Verdes Newspapers, Inc., has been announced by Carl P. Miller, president of the publishing company. Effective date of the purchase was Feb. 1, 1963.

The Lomita News and its companion publication, the Rolling Hills News, were purchased from Ray H. Reed and Robert B. Wilcox. The Lomita News has been published in the unincorporated community for more than 42 years.

Palos Verdes Newspapers publishes the Palos Verdes News, Rolling Hills Herald, Hollywood Riviera Tribune, and Peninsula News-Herald. Miller heads a group which purchased the publications two and a half years ago.

IN MAKING the announcement of the purchase, Miller said that the Lomita operation would be continued as a completely separate newspaper, to continue to serve its own community.

Mechanical and business operations will be combined with Palos Verdes Newspapers in that company's new offset publishing plant, with the acquired properties converted to offset immediately.

Howard Seelye, vice presi-

dent and general manager of Palos Verdes Newspapers, will be in charge of the operation. Ted Herrmann, who recently joined the company as advertising director, will be in charge of the overall advertising program.

James Cole, managing editor of the Lomita News, will continue in that capacity and A. E. (Lefty) Gross will move from Palos Verdes Newspapers to become advertising manager of the Lomita publications.

MILLER IS former president of San Gabriel Valley Newspapers and is executive director of the Wall Street Journal's West Coast edition. He is president-elect of Rotary International.

Other officials of Palos Verdes Newspapers are A. Q. Miller Jr., director, who is vice president and general manager of San Gabriel Valley Newspapers in West Covina; S. Earl Wright, partner in the law firm of Wright, Wright, Goldwater & Mack, who serves as secretary and performed in the same capacity for San Gabriel Newspapers, and Carl P. Miller Jr., assistant secretary.

The Lomita News and Rolling Hills News have a combined controlled circulation of 12,400.

### Developing Center to Use in Nuclear Crisis

Torrance is one of 10 cities in the Southern California area which is working towards the development of an emergency operating center where government could continue to function during a nuclear crisis.

Charles Manfred, state Disaster Office administrator for the mutual aid program that includes Torrance, Pomona, Buena Park, Montebello, Norwalk, Beverly Hills, Santa Monica, Riverside, Burbank and Irwindale attributed the upsurge in ECC planning to local initiative and the assistance of the federal matching funds program.

The first step in obtaining an emergency operating center under the federal program is to submit a justification to the California Disaster Office for processing before it goes to the Office of Civil Defense-Department of Defense for approval.

Torrance has submitted its Phase 1 papers.

### Jones to Head Delegation To Drycleaners' Meeting

Tom Jones, Waleria Cleaners, is leaving on Feb. 6 for the International Dry Cleaners Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii. Jones is the president of this international organization, which has vice presidents from Japan, Republic of China, Canada, Guam, and Hawaii.

The convention is the Fifth Annual International Drycleaners Convention which is conducted by the International Drycleaners Congress of the Pacific. The purpose of the organization is to improve international good will among the countries bordering the Pacific Basin, particularly, by encouraging personal friendships among drycleaners from the various nations. The organization also assists in exchange of information among drycleaners operating in the widely differing economic systems existing in the nations involved.

ABOUT 125 delegates will attend from the United States; 25 from Japan, and varying numbers from other nations, with a total attendance expected to exceed 250 delegates.

Takeo Igarashi, the vice president of the IDC from Japan, is president of the largest combined laundry and dry-

cleaning company in the world, with over 3,000 employees in 15 plants.

M. C. Mao, vice president from the Republic of China, (Taiwan) has a business capitalized at over \$1,000,000. These large operators are vitally interested in the ways of doing business in this country, and have visited the Waleria Cleaners as well as other plants in the area.

The first IDC convention was held in Tokyo, Japan, in 1959, and Jones was one of the delegates, having originated the idea for such an organization.

### UCLA Scholarship Awards Available to Area Youth

Applications for \$40,000 worth of UCLA Alumni Assn. scholarships are now available from counselors in local high schools or from the university, D. E. Johnston, Torrance-San Pedro-Palos Verdes district scholarship chairman, announced this week. High school seniors who will enter UCLA next September are eligible for the awards of \$200 and \$400.

Approximately 165 scholarships will be awarded by the association. The exact number which will go to the students from local high schools will depend upon the number of eligible applications received from this district and will be determined after the filing deadline, Feb. 28.

The greater the number of eligible applications, the greater the allotment of scholarships.

**LOCAL WINNERS** are selected by a district alumni committee after a review of the applications and interviews with district finalists.

Outstanding district winners will be nominated by the Torrance-San Pedro-Palos Verdes committee for the Clarence Dykstra and Edward Dickson Memorial Scholarships and other special memorial awards which range up to \$1,000.

The Dykstra and Dickson scholarships go to the top entering boy and girl freshman, respectively. Selection of these winners is made by the 24 district and five area chairmen from the state.

Winners of both the district and special scholarships will be announced in May, Johnston said.
