

Atomic Science Subject of TV

Atomic fission in reverse is the subject of the weekly "It Is Written" telecast Saturday at 7:30 p.m. on KCOP, Channel 13, according to an announcement by Pastor Manson Metcalf of the Torrance Seventh-day Adventist Church.

Titled "Atomic Trigger," the half-hour telecast depicts in

picture and narrative the development of atomic science from 1934, when a mistake by the Italian scientist, Enrico Fermi, started science on the road that led to the splitting of the atom, to present-day developments, including recent bomb tests in the Pacific.

"Man's unlocking of the secrets of the atom sometimes seems to be an echo from the pages of the Bible," Pastor Metcalf commented in announcing the release of the telecast.

"Many of the imagined contradictions between Scripture and science have been transformed as a result of recent discoveries into confirmations of the accuracy of the ancient Book," the minister asserted. The "It Is Written" telecast seeks to interpret modern man's search for religious truth in the light of scientific and historical discoveries in our day.

In addition to the Saturday night release time, an "It Is Written" program is released weekly on KTLA, Channel 5, at 12:30 p.m. on Sundays.

A special program for Sunday afternoon, March 3, has been scheduled by the rector. He will present an illustrated lecture on the Holy Land to
