Fellowship Program At AAUW Meeting

The fellowships program of the American Association of University Women will be featured in a twofold presentation at the Monday, Feb. 11, general meeting of the Manhattan Beach Branch of the association.

The meeting will convene at the Community Church, 303 S. Peck Ave., Manhattan Beach, with refreshments to be served at 7:30 p.m.

"Fashions in Fellowships," a slide-discussion, will be delivered by Mrs. Winston Maltby, fellowships chairman of the Long Beach Branch. The film presents facts about the fellowships program, along with an overview of women's fashions in the United States from the 1880s to the present, with a projection into the future.

Mrs. Luigi Salvaneschi, member of the Manhattan Beach Branch, will speak to the group about her experiences as an AAUW fellow in Italy in 1956-1957. The received the fellowship to do advanced study in fourteenth century law.

Since the inception of the program in 1888, three million dollars have been awarded to 1,500 scholars. Last year 52 national and 57 international awards were granted for study in a wide diversity of subject fields. A 1962-1963 development in the program was the inauguration of awards for out-

standing women teachers of Africa.

Annually the Manhattan Beach Branch contributes funds to the fellowship program. Last year the group gave over \$500, most of it in memoriam of Mrs. Thron Riggs.

The contribution for 1963 will be over \$600, according to Mrs. Lowell Dunham, branch fellowships chairman. Monies are raised by the assessment of individual members and by fund-raising projects.

Interested individuals are invited to attend the meeting as guests, according to Mrs. Orlando Tafuya, program chairman.
