





Good Teaching Conference Set Next Saturday

Teachers of the Torrance Unified School District and interested citizens will have an opportunity on March 2 to observe an array of teaching practices in the classrooms presented by Torrance teachers whose combined teaching experiences would probably total over 700 years. The stage for this extravaganza will be in the classrooms at South High School where 82 teachers will present the fruits of their educational experiences.

The event will begin at 8:30 a.m. with registration and hospitality hour. At 9:30 a.m. a general meeting for all teachers will be held. The first schedule of demonstrations will be held from 10:30 to 11:15 a.m., and the second from 11:30 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. It is contemplated that most persons in attendance will also be at the luncheon which is to be held in the cafeteria from 12:30 to 1:30 p.m.

The conference will allow two institute credits.
