The Braille Institute needs drivers for several hundred blind people who will be attending fall classes at the institute. Drivers are especially needed for the Southwestern area, reports Mrs. Sinclair.

Most volunteer drivers simply deliver the students at the local pick-up point for buses. Many volunteers who drive children to the institute fill the hours from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. with volunteer clerical work. In any event, if you have one day a week, or part of that day, lend a hand.


