Vincent Thomas Now a Skipper

Assemblyman Vincent Thomas (D-San Pedro) has been named honorary skipper of the annual Fishermen's Fiesta, scheduled for Sept. 27-29 at the Port of Los Angeles in San Pedro.

A boat parade, featuring decorated fishing vessels, will be the highlight of the Fiesta. At last year's Fiesta, Governor Edmund G. Brown served as honorary skipper and will accompany Thomas in the lead boat this year.

The sea parade will follow by one day dedication ceremonies for the Vincent Thomas Bridge, the third largest bridge in the state and Southern California's first major structure of its nature.

FIESTA and dedication celebrations combined will add up to the largest weekend in the history of the Los Angeles Harbor-San Pedro area.

Besides the colorful boat parade and the dedication ceremonies, the three-day period will include a land parade, luncheon on board vessels for visiting state officials, a dedication reception and dinner, public dancing, carnival rides and a Navy open house.

THE BRIDGE was named in honor of Thomas by a resolution of the 1961 Legislature in recognition of his efforts on the project.

Spanning the main channel of the Port of Los Angeles to join the San Pedro mainland and the Terminal Island districts of the Harbor, the bridge was completed at a cost of \$22 million and reaches 6,060 feet in length and has a clear height of 185 feet above the water.
