North High Holds 50 UC Courses

North High School will be the focal point of the 85 University of California fall extension courses to be offered in the Southland.

Of the 85 courses and special programs to be offered in a variety of locations from Culver City to San Pedro, North High, 3620 W. 182nd St., will host approximately 50.

Five special programs will be held during the season in the fields of art, sociology, music, business administration and liberal arts.

"VALUE OF THE Arts" will be given beginning Oct. 8 at North High under the coordination of William Richard Wilson, graphic artist and art director of the Sander Publications. The program will be open to the public and is termed either a lecture series or credit course.

Art, literature, dance and music will be subjects for study in the two-part program. Guest artists, specialists in their fields, will speak and perform at each of the meetings.

"INDIVIDUAL Behavior in a Mass Society," a six-meeting course, will begin on Sept. 30 at North High and be held on alternate Mondays through Dec. 16.

Two music programs are also planned. "Masters of Music," will be coordinated by Henri Temianka, first violinist and co-founder of the Paganini Quartet. Each evening he will be joined by a guest artist in

the performance of a master work.

THE PROGRAM will run from 8 to 10 p.m. on Saturdays at the South High School auditorium. Performances will be held Oct. 26, Nov. 2 and 9.

"Development of Jazz" will be a non-technical introduction to jazz featuring guest artists and demonstrations, Paul Tanner, trombonist, will be coordinator for the 15 Wednesday evening meetings beginning Sept. 25 at North High.

ENROLLMENT to the course will include admission to two special concerts at Royce Hall on the UCLA campus featuring Jerry Mulligan's Quartet on Oct. 23 and John Coltrane's Quartet on Oct. 26.

"Small Business Management," offered in cooperation with the Small Business Administration, will be held for eight Tuesdays beginning Sept. 17 at North High.

MANAGEMENT consultant Robert H. Colley will be coordinator and guest speakers will appear at each of the meetings.

Additional programs will be held in El Segundo, San Pedro, Lawndale, Manhattan Beach, Lennox, Hawthorne, Redondo Beach, Playa del Rey, Palos Verdes, Inglewood and Culver City.
