

Bus Trip to Shakespeare Festival Set

A theatre bus trip to the San Diego National Shakespeare Festival for a matinee performance of "Midsummer Night's Dream" will be conducted this Saturday by the Torrance Recreation Department.

The bus will leave the Torrance City Hall parking lot, 3031 Torrance Boulevard, at 9 a.m. Arrival time at Balboa Park, San Diego, will be approximately 12:30 p.m., so there will be time for picnick-

ing or visiting the zoo before the matinee at 2 p.m. The cost of the trip is \$5.75 and includes ticket, bus transportation, and trip insurance. Teen-agers at least 13 years old are welcome on the trip with their parents.

The Shakespeare Festival in San Diego has had excellent reviews this summer and many of the performances have been completely sold out. "Midsummer Night's Dream" is delightful summer fare

Funds Voted For Work on Area Channel

The Board of Supervisors has approved a Flood Control District request to spend \$140,000 to import clay material needed for the Dominguez Channel flood control improvement in Wilmington.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace said the funds will supplement costs voted for the project previously.

Board action was taken, Chace said, on a report from contractor Peter Kiewit Sons' Co. that an additional clay is needed for lining the banks and bottom of the channel which extends from Henry

Ford Avenue to Wilmington Avenue. It is intended, the Supervisor reports, that the additional clay will be utilized for the next portion of channel construction from Wilmington Avenue to Avalon Boulevard, and a section above Avalon expected to be under contract next spring.

Chace said the quantity of excavation of the next two units will offset the costs of extra clay supplies at this time. The Kiewit firm currently is constructing the Henry

Ford-Wilmington Avenue section under a \$6.5 million contract due for completion next April.

Guy F. Atkinson Co. of Long Beach is working on the Wilmington Avenue-Avalon Boulevard section under a \$3.4 million contract due for completion late in 1965.

Improvements Slated for Carson Area
Improvement of portions of three streets in the Carson-Dominguez area at a cost of \$9,280 has been approved by the Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace said the improvements will include portions of 213th Street near Legend Avenue; Martin Street near 213th Street; and Water Street near Ballard Street.

Another proposed project in this area will be the Carson Street-Wilmington Avenue intersection. The work will include reinstalling conduit and relocating service in conjunction with new curbs constructed under County permit.

Chace said the Board also provided additional funds to include a traffic island at the Carson-Wilmington intersection which carries 19,000 vehicles daily.

Western Avenue Project Slated
A portion of Western Avenue within the City of Torrance will be improved under a \$5,100 allocation approved by the Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Burton W. Chace said the improvement will be on Western between 235th and 238th Streets, including pavement, curbs and drainage structures.
