

# Social Security Office Plans Initial Birthday Celebration

Torrance's Social Security Office, 1408 Crenshaw Blvd., will observe its first anniversary Tuesday.

More than 5,200 applications have been filed by or on behalf of persons entitled to old age, survivors and disability insurance benefits during the office's first year of operation in the Torrance location.

In addition to Torrance, the local social security office also serves Compton, Harbor City, Gardena, Redondo Beach, Hermosa Beach, Manhattan Beach, Lawndale, Rolling Hills, Rolling Hills Estates, Palos Verdes Estates.

**THE TORRANCE** office, in addition to processing the 5,200 applications, has issued 12,696 new and duplicate social security account number cards and answered over 21,000 written, personal and telephone inquiries from the public in the area served by the district office.

At the present time there are more than 26,000 residents in the area receiving about 1.7 million dollars in monthly benefits, according to Miles Davis, district manager of the local office.

Davis further noted that most of the money is spent right here in the area for

necessities such as food, rent, clothes and utilities. "We know for a fact that these checks are immediately cashed and are a tremendous stimulant to business," Davis added.

**MOST OF** the beneficiaries are 62 years of age or older but there are approximately 3,200 minor children and adult disabled before age 18 who are getting benefits on the record of a deceased wage earner, many of whom may never have realized that the social security tax which they paid as they worked would some day help their own children.

Survivors benefits are paid to widows, aged dependent parents and widowers. In many instances the social security benefits to individual families are the equivalent of a large estate even though the deceased worker may have only a moderate income during his working life time.

**IN ADDITION** to monthly benefits a lump-sum death payment is made to the surviving widow of widower if the couple were living in the same household at the time of death. When no eligible spouse survives the deceased wage earner, the lump-sum benefit is

paid to the person assuming responsibility for the burial expenses or directly to the funeral home.

Many of the 62-year old people who elect to receive reduced benefits and retire before age 65 are continuing to work on a part-time basis or have accepted less demanding jobs at lower pay to supplement their social security benefit checks.

**THERE ARE** approximately 1,600 disabled workers in the area served by the Torrance District Office receiving social

security disability payments not only for themselves but also for their wives and minor children. These monthly benefit checks bring a sense of independence as well as security to the aged and disabled.

Davis once again emphasized, "If you have any question whatsoever regarding social security, please come in an discuss the matter with us. If anyone has been turned down for social security benefits in the past, come in again since work requirements have been drastically reduced in the past few years."

**SECTION 1.**  
That the amount of money necessary to be raised by taxation on the taxable property in the City of Torrance for general municipal purposes for library purposes; to pay the obligations of the City to the State Employees' Retirement System; for the payment of principal or interest on bonded or other indebtedness of the City; and for parks, playgrounds and recreational centers purposes, is hereby fixed and determined in the following manner:

A. For general municipal purposes, the sum of \$2,011,404.

B. For library purposes, the sum of \$157,656.

C. To pay the obligations of the City to the State Employees' Retirement System, the sum of \$403,440.

D. For payment of principal and interest maturing on Municipal Improvement Bonds, Series 1954, the sum of \$18,137.

E. For payment of principal and interest maturing on Municipal Improvement Bonds, Series 1955, the sum of \$42,972.

F. For parks, playgrounds and recreational centers purposes, the sum of \$146,450.
