Authority for the motion, according to Isen, is a section of California Constitution which gives the Attorney General supervision of law enforcement officers.

Condominium Plan Voted By Council

An emergency ordinance controlling the development of condominiums and community apartment projects was adopted by the City Council Tuesday evening. The ordinance creates a Planned-Development Overlay District (P-D) and sets forth standards for the development of condominium projects.

The emergency ordinance was adopted because a new state law providing for the control of such projects by the state in the absence of local controls becomes effective Sept. 19.

THE ORDINANCE will permit condominium developments in R-3 zones designated as part of the overlay districts.

The council also approved the new professional-residential zone in the city. The new zone will permit the construction of apartments or professional offices in areas where single family development is impractical, or where heavy commercial activity is undesirable. The R-P zones will be established by the City Council after recommendation of the planning commission.

Land zoned for R-P use will generally be located on major streets in the South Torrance oilfield area. Residences and professional offices will not be permitted on the same property.
