

Knights of Columbus Set General Assembly Sunday

A General Assembly Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus, will be instituted Sunday at 1 p.m. at the Mary Star of the Sea auditorium in San Pedro. Institution will be conducted by Edward J. Campbell, Faithful Master of the Fourth Degree. A banquet has been scheduled to follow the ceremonies at 5 p.m. The public is being invited to attend the affair, according to Larry Sargent, Faithful Captain of the General Assembly. Charges for the banquet will be \$5 a plate, he said. Sunday is the anniversary of the death of Cmdr. John J. Shea, who went down with the aircraft carrier Wasp in Japanese waters during World War II. A letter to his son written before the fatal attack on the carrier has become a classic. In it, Commander Shea spoke of wishing to be able to play ball, go mountaoin climbing, see the trees and brooks, and learn all about woodcraft, hunting, fishing, swimming, and other activities with his young son, and admonished the boy to "take good care of mother. Be a good by and grow up to be a good young man." Sunday's General Assembly will honor Commander Shea's memory, Sargent said.

Witnesses Hold Final Session

"Man's time limit for exercising sovereignty over the earth has nearly expired and God's resumption of full control will soon be seen," Nathan H. Knorr, president of the Watch Tower Society, told Jehovah's Witnesses at the windup session of the eight-day "Everlasting Good News" Assembly which concluded Sunday at the Rose Bowl.

Local Witnesses were among the 118,447 convention delegates and visitors who heard Knorr deliver the highlight address of the convention, "When God Is King over All the Earth."

Knorr pointed out how men's efforts to establish ideal governments have failed. He cited as evidence skyrocketing costs of government on all levels, labor problems, population explosion, food shortages and fear of nuclear war.

A social hour will begin at 11 p.m., one hour prior to the midnight services.


Tickets are still available for the High Holiday services, according to chairman David Schenbaum.
