 police department and one in the fire department, and "such limitation cannot assure the citizens that the departments will be given the best leadership available."
WHILE IT did not discuss the open examination question Tuesday, the City Council did approve a plan to have several specialists from the Los Angeles make a study of the organiza-

tion and administration of the Torrance Police Department. The council originally voted to hire one "expert" to conduct the study on a full-time basis, but after a huddle between City Manager Wade Peebles and Sheriff Peter J. Pitchess, it was agreed that the best solution would be several specialists.
THE STUDY was ordered in the aftermath of difficulties in the Police Department brought on by the arrests of three officers.

Attorney General Stanley Mosk's office is currently conducting an investigation of the local department.
 Councilmen voted Tuesday evening to concur in the recommendation of the city manager without comment.

Trustees Authorize Bond Sale

Trustees of the Torrance Unified School District authorized the sale of \$1,870,000 in bonds for construction projects at their meeting Monday evening. The board asked the Board of Supervisors to make the sale as quickly as possible in the resolution authorizing the bonds sale. It is the first such sale since the recent bond election, and includes \$270,000 remaining from the 1958 election. The authorization includes

\$1,600,000 from the April election. After the current sale, the district will have \$6,400,000 remaining from the last election.

FUNDS FROM the sale will include monies to complete construction of the West High School second and third increments, Joseph Arnold School, and for the additions to Wood and Hickory schools.

The trustees also authorized contracts for bids totaling \$25,289.87 for equipment and supplies. Included in the contract was one for \$8,800 for data processing of high school grades. The system is used to screen students who may need additional help.

THE BOARD also adopted change orders for construction jobs now under way totaling nearly \$7,500. The orders deal principally with job difficulties encountered at the Joseph Arnold school site.

S. E. Waldrip, assistant superintendent for business, was authorized to proceed with escrow instructions for a new school site near Del Amo Boulevard and Hawthorne Avenue. The site was purchased in lieu of a previous site near Spencer and Earl Streets which had been under study. Total cost of new site is expected to be about \$160,000 for about four and a half acres.

The Mayor is miffed by the long-standing reference to portions of the City and County of Los Angeles which have Torrance mailing addresses as Torrance. Latest in the series of confusing references was last week's robbery of the Pacific State Bank in the Carson Center, which was reported as a "Torrance Bank." Isen also read a letter to the council which blamed Torrance for poor schools and unsanitary conditions in Los Angeles County. Councilman Nicholas Drane reminded the mayor that residents of the Carson-Dominguez area are now trying to incorporate the area and expressed hope that would cure the problem. With a bang of his gavel, the mayor wished the incorporation committee good luck.
