Captain Warthan, whose parents live at 650 Border Ave., Torrance, entered the Army in December 1951.





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Career Army Man Retires

Sgt. I.C. Vern A. Brown, 115 Calle Mayor, was awarded the Army's Commendation Medal at ceremonies held recently at the USAR Center, 1250 Federal Ave., Los Angeles, in ceremonies marking his retirement from the Army after more than 20 years service.

In making the presentation, Lt. Col. Herbert Barnett, Northwest Los Angeles Subsector Commander, XV United States Army Corps, read the citation accompanying the medal which commended Sgt. Brown for his outstanding service as Assistant Unit Advisor to several USAR units at the center from November 1959 until his retirement May 31. In part, the citation commended Sgt. Brown, a veteran of the Normandy D-Day Invasion, for consistently carrying out his many responsible duties "in a highly competent and noteworthy manner."

In other ceremonies, Lt. Col. Paul R. Jackson, Commanding Officer, 387th M.P. Bn., USAR, read a letter of appreciation to Sgt. Brown thanking him for his work with that unit. Col. Jackson, in civilian life assigned to the traffic education radio and television division of the Los Angeles Police Department, presented Sgt. Brown with a gift from the unit.

Entering the Army in Los Angeles in January 1942, Sgt. Brown saw action in Europe with the Infantry. In addition to his Normandy action he was in the Battle of the Bulge. He is the holder of the Bronze Star for Valor.

After World War II, he served in Germany and Okinawa and as a USAR adviser in Santa Monica. He resides with his wife, Dorothy, and two daughters, Brigitte and Gabrielle at the Torrance address.
