

Registration for Summer Recreation Program Open

Torrance Recreation Department will hold "Recreation Registration" for summer activities this weekend at the Recreation Center building, 341 Torrance Blvd. Registrations will be accepted from 2 until 8 p.m. today and Friday and from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday.

A "Learn to Swim Campaign" for children 7 to 12 years old will begin June 17 with instructions offered in six, two-week sessions: June 17 to June 28, July 1 to 12, July 15 to 26, July 29 to Aug. 9, Aug. 12 to 23, and Aug. 26 to Sept. 6. Classes will meet daily Monday through Friday at 9 a.m., 10 a.m. and 11 a.m. Instruction includes beginner, advanced beginner, intermediate, and swimmer classifications. A pool use fee of \$2 is charged for the 10 lessons.

OTHER SWIM classes are held in the early evenings 5 to 7 p.m. include youth swim

classes for ages 13 to 18, adult swim classes, junior life saving, senior life saving, synchronized swimming, and junior frogmen. A competitive swim class is being held during the noon hour. A pool use fee is charged for each session depending on the number of class meetings.

Other activities for which registrations will be accepted at the "Recreation Registration" include the following: Modern dance classes at Vic-

tor School Playground, El Retiro Park, McMaster Park, and Hickory School Playgrounds; folk dance class at El Retiro Park; tumbling and gymnastics at WALTERIA, South High, and North High; "Fun-Thru-Music," McMaster Park, WALTERIA Park, El Retiro Park, and Torrance Recreation Center; tennis classes offered at El Retiro Park, North High, South High School, and West High School; youth golf lessons at the parks and Sea-Aire Golf

Course; and adult golf lessons at Sea-Aire Golf Course.

REGISTRATIONS also will be accepted for the arts and crafts center classes including crafts, puppets and stage-craft. Space age junior cooks, housewives bowling league, dog obedience class for children, youth drama summer stock and Chippewa pow wow day camp and Camp Clatawa in the mountains.

In some of these activities there is a nominal fee to cover costs of materials and incidentals. Day camp and mountain camp have fees to cover the expense involved. Schedules for the recreation programs are available at the Recreation Department in the City Hall, 3031 Torrance Blvd.

Law In Action

Many people are concerned with excessive high school dropouts.

Parents have a legal duty to see that children, eight to sixteen, go to school unless the law exempts them. If the youngster misses three days of school without an excuse, the school board may treat him as a truant, and may call the parent in to find out why he is absent.

The habitual truant may be ordered before the juvenile court to explain his conduct. It may make him a ward of the court and place him in another home if his parents are not properly caring for him.

THE STUDENT who is expelled for disobedience or for other misconduct faces many problems:

1. Young men or women under 18 need a work permit which they may not get if they have not finished school.

2. The out-of-school and out-of-work youngsters cannot loiter around a school or any place else where school children usually gather, such as a bus stop.

3. Most cities forbid youngsters under 18 from loitering about the streets after 10:00 p.m.

4. Their parents can be held liable for the youngster's actions. If he does malicious damage, the parents may have to pay damages for each such act.

5. Parents who do not take care of their children properly or who allow them to loiter about at night, may have to face charges of contributing to the delinquency of minors. A serious crime.

IN ALL YOUNG people who are too young to work but who do not attend school have a hard time of it these days and are likely to have a harder one in the future.

Recently many educational and other agencies have begun to study and work to make dropouts take a new interest in school.


