Reynolds Metals Opens Aluminum Can Line Here

The Reynolds Metals Co. has announced equipment to produce aluminum tuna cans and beer can lids has been installed at its Torrance plant. The tuna installation makes seamless aluminum containers economically available to West Coast packers, who account for 95 per cent of the nation's canned tuna output. REYNOLDS also announced that it is doubling its capacity for coating and treating alumi-

nium can stock. More than \$2 million in new high speed machinery is being installed at the firm's can metal processing plant in Sheffield, Ala., and the Reynolds alloys plant near the same town, according to W. Monroe Wells, vice president in charge of operations. The Sheffield plant performs coating, lithographing, slitting and other treating operations to prepare aluminum for use at Reynolds can making plants and by other can makers.

Both moves were prompted by rapidly increasing demand for aluminum in various canning applications, Wells said. Production of aluminum cans this year is expected to top 2 billion for the first time. TWO TUNA CAN lines with total capacity of 80,000,000 cans annually have been installed at the Torrance facility. The shallow container also is suitable for crabmeat, potted meats, and other seafood and specialty meat products.



SEAMLESS TUNA CANS . . . The Reynolds Metals Co. of Torrance has announced it is launching production of aluminum tuna cans and beer can lids. The tuna can will be produced at 300 per minute, directly from pre-coated coil, in the shallow drawing press above. The cans "nest" when stacked, and will weigh less than half as much as cans made of "thin" tinplate, thus reducing tuna freight costs an average of \$1.25 per 1,000 cans, Reynolds officials said.

Law in Action

We often read that a friend got a huge sum in a personal injury case, like an automobile accident, but in another case that looks much the same Brown got nothing.

How come? Financial recovery rests almost wholly at discretion of the trial court or jury. Without evidence of prejudice of some kind, no higher court is likely to change such an award. For who is better able to set an award than the judge or jury that heard every witness?

Many things guide a court in making a personal injury judgment. But however great the harm, it is rare that the injured party can recover unless the defendant was at fault, and the injured party was not.

SOME factors that may go into a judgment:
1. Impairment of earnings: The worth of one's actual lost time in earnings can be recovered as well as the value of one's earning power.
2. Impairment of future earnings: In case of a permanent disability, for example, the court looks at what one may reasonably have expected to earn the rest of his life in view of one's education or training and his special talents and prospects.
3. Medical care and other such expenses as future surgery, if needed; future care; nursing; special medical equipment, etc.
4. A husband may recover damages for loss of "consortium," (his wife's companionship and services).
5. Physical pain and suffering; sometimes fright or shock when injured; humiliation resulting from disfigurement or disability.

IF THE injured person dies, his heirs if close of kin can recover for their loss of money as well as society and companionship. Young children or a husband or a wife, for example, can recover financially if they can show loss of earning power, advice, and society.
