

Rabbi Unger Takes Over Duties Here City Adopts New Rubbish Bill System

Rabbi Jerome A. Unger has assumed duties as the new spiritual leader of Temple Menorah. Rabbi Unger replaces Rabbi Henri E. Front, who has accepted a position with the Union American Hebrew Congregation.

Rabbi Unger performed his first service at Temple Menorah on July 5. He will be officially installed later this fall. Educated at Chico State College and the University of California at Berkeley, Rabbi Unger also attended the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. He received his master's degree in Hebrew Letters.

Ordnained in 1960, Rabbi Unger has served for the past three years as the representative to Israel of the World Union for Progressive Judaism. The Rabbi was instrumental in the founding of the progressive movement in Israel, and was the founding Rabbi for the Upper Nazareth and the Kfar Shmeryahu-Herziya Congregation. He also participated in the writing of the first reform prayerbook printed in Hebrew.

Carson Area Funds Approved
Resurfacing and widening of Francisco Street in the Carson area will begin next week under the provisions of a \$14,500 appropriation made this week by the Board of Supervisors. The project includes the area between Normandie Avenue and Vermont Avenue.

Approve Funds
Improvements on Eshelman Avenue between Pacific Coast Highway and 259th Place in Lomita will begin this week following allocation of \$6,500 for the work by county supervisors. The project calls for new pavement and an extension to a portion of the street.

In an effort to cut costs, Torrance will begin house-to-house delivery of its rubbish bills to an estimated 22,500 of its 25,000 households. The remainder of the bills will be mailed, chiefly to non-resident owners.

The system of house-to-house delivery has been used for

many years by Burbank and Pasadena, but is an innovation for this area. Any resident who would rather receive his rubbish bill through the mail can do so by

indicating mail delivery on the stub which is returned with the payment. The new procedure is expected to save the city about \$3,000 annually.
