Andre Previn Guests At Peninsula Concert

Andre Previn will be the featured soloist and guest conductor at the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra during a concert at the Marineland Sea Arena. It will be the first performance on the Peninsula for the orchestra, and Previn's first appearance at Marineland. The concert, for the benefit of the Philharmonic, will begin at 8 p.m. Friday, Aug. 16. All seats will be reserved at the open air theater.

PREVIN, WHO has appeared with the Philharmonic for the past eight years at the Hollywood Bowl, is also a versatile composer. He won an academy award for his scoring of "Gigi," and for his work in "Porgy and Bess." He has arranged or composed the music for nearly 40 motion pictures.

Born in Berlin, Previn came to the United States with his parents in the late 1930s. He attended high school in Beverly Hills, and began his career in show business at the age of 17. During the past few years he has made numerous appearances on television, and has made several tours throughout the United States.
