

## Wren Seeks Permanent GOP District Offices

Attorney General John M. Wren, newly elected Republican chairman for the 17th congressional district said this week his primary goal as chairman will be open a permanent, fully staffed Republican headquarters.

Financing of the office is assured, according to Wren, and office furniture is available. He added that enough volunteers have signed up for the project to assure its success.

The 17th district is composed of the 67th and 68th Assembly districts and includes parts of Torrance, Lawndale, Hawthorne, Gardena, Redondo

Beach, Wilmington, Lomita, and San Pedro. Wren said the GOP central committees in both assembly districts have indicated they will assist in the establishment of a permanent headquarters.

**MEMBERS OF THE 67th district central committee in addition to Wren are Jean Haley Charles Soderstrom, Alice T. Hawkins, Douglas Scott, and Jack Montgomery. Alternates to the committee are Dave Attridge, Marie Holden, Pauline Keith, and George Heaton. Richard Wonder is an ex-officio member and Montgomery is chairman.**

Wallace J. Houde serves as chairman of the 68th district central committee. Other members are Ralph Fanberg, Don Hilliard, Jerry Hills, Kathleen Massa, James Peters, and Ivan Turnat. Alternates are Adrian Sumie, James Adams, Chauncey Larmer, Jean Tinsley, Anita Sharpe, William Woolson, and Dale Thompson. Former assembly candidate Alfred Thorsen is an ex-officio member.

**TEMPORARY headquarters for the party are located at 2271 Torrance Blvd. Wren said larger and more adequate facilities are needed and the**

office will be moved as soon as a new location is found.

The headquarters may be reached by calling FA 8-1776. The number will be retained when permanent facilities are located. Meetings of the central committee are currently held at Torrance Elementary School on the first Monday of each month.
