Bureau Seeks Volunteers to Aid Families

County Buys Land Parcels

Two parcels of land near Torrance have been purchased by the county for use in the County Flood Control District's improvement of Dominguez Channel.

The district was authorized by supervisors to pay Bert W. and Ada Martin \$9,803 for the parcels, located on the north side of 213th Street, just west of Chico Street.

One contains 20,679 square feet and the other 16,928 square feet.

Both are needed in the improvement of a unit of Dominguez Channel running from Avalon Boulevard to Wilmington Avenue.

The section is currently being constructed by the Guy F. Atkinson Co., of Long Beach, under terms of a \$3,466,329 contract awarded July 30 of last year. It is due for completion late in 1965.

The 18-mile Dominguez Channel is being improved in sections by the Flood Control District from its headquarters in Inglewood to its outlet at San Pedro Bay.

Total cost of the entire project is expected to run around \$30 million.

Preparation Begins for Art Center

Earth moving equipment will be a part of the landscape at Harbor College during the next few weeks as the excavation for the new Art Building progresses.

The building site is located on the northwest corner of the campus. Bulldozers have razed several barns and other farm buildings which remained from earlier days.

A contract for site preparation in the amount of \$156,000 was awarded to Sully-Miller Contracting Co. Construction of the new art center and classroom complex will begin as soon as the site preparation is completed.
