Edison Co. To Refund \$6,432,000

Southern California Edison Co. will initiate refunds to customers for the bimonthly period which began Monday. Refunds, to be applied as credit to bills, will amount to 78 cents to each of the company's domestic customers.

Total refunds will amount to \$6,432,000, which represents the amount received by the company following settlement of El Paso Natural Gas Co. rate case negotiated by the California Public Utilities Commission.

Edison, which recently acquired California Electric Power Co., provides service in Imperial, Inyo, Fresno, Kern, Kings, Los Angeles, Madera, Mono, Orange, Riverside, San Bernardino, Santa Barbara, Tulare and Ventura Counties.

Home Savings Leads in Real Estate Loans

Home Savings and Loan Assn. led the real estate lending field with a 71 per cent margin in money volume over its nearest competitor in 1963.

Total loan activity in the county during this period was \$6.6 billion, a 29 per cent increase over the \$5.1 billion recorded the previous year, according to a yearly summary prepared by the Realty Tax and Service Co.

Businessmen Join Attack On Diseases

Delmer Fox of Hawthorne, chairman of the Southwest Region "Business With A Heart" volunteers, said calls will be made on each firm.

"Too often men in their prime of life are stricken with a heart disorder and the Surgeon General's report proclaiming smoking as a health hazard has shown that something can be done to help prevent these heart disorders."

"MOST PEOPLE are either trying to give up the smoking habit themselves or wanting to help in the campaigns to keep teen-agers from starting to smoke," Fox said.

The Heart Association's campaign against smoking launched last June will be made stronger and more effective with contributions received from this February's Heart Fund Drive.

He stressed that the Heart Association's program is solidly based on scientific research, heart-guarding education and real community service that dollars invested here bring heart-saving services directly to residents of this area.
