

Toastmaster Contest Set Saturday

Members of the Area 3 Toastmasters Clubs will meet Saturday at 7 p.m. for their annual serious speech contest.

Area 3 clubs include Lomita, San Pedro, Rolling Hills, Palos Verdes, Wilmington, and Harbor View Toastmasters Clubs. Dr. Warren Low, area governor, will be the chairman for the meeting Gene Mahoney, president of the San Pedro club, will be hospitality chairman.

Rudy Hafernik, winner of last year's contest, will be the toastmaster of the evening. Walter Hull of the Lomita Club will be the topic master for tail tales.

Dr. Low will represent the Lomita Club in the serious speech contest. His topic will be "The Man Who Wouldn't Quit." H. E. Jacobsen also will represent the Lomita Club.

Area Youth Bands Plan Bowl Debut

The Torrance Junior and Senior Youth Bands will participate with 31 other youth bands from Southern California in the Youth Band Council Concert and Marching Adjudication Feb. 22 and 23.

Moving to the Hollywood Bowl for the first time this year, the program will feature the young bands appearing individually on the stage giving 30-minute concerts, and in a marching "pass-in-review" on the second elevation of the bowl's south parking lot.

JUDGING begins at 8:30 a.m. Saturday morning and at 12 noon on Sunday. Presentations will end both days at 5:30 p.m. Judges for the adjudication are selected band directors from the colleges and universities in the greater Los Angeles area. The entire event is open to spectators free of charge, and is designed to be a showcase for Southern California's unique youth band movement.

OVER 300 of the best musicians from the youth bands appearing in the adjudication will also be privately auditioned at the Bowl for membership in the 1964 All Southern California Youth Honor Band.

All of the participating youth bands and the honor band will appear in the Youth Band Council's 9th Annual "Youth Band Festival," co-sponsored by the Los Angeles County Music Commission, to be held in the Shrine Auditorium Saturday, May 23, at 8 p.m.

This elaborate musical production will feature more than 2,000 young musicians, major-ettes, and drill teams.
