Language Programs Explained

Members of the Torrance Education Advisory Committee were given a demonstration of new methods of teaching foreign languages at a luncheon meeting Monday.

Teachers and students from Torrance High School held class before the large group to demonstrate the new audio-lingual techniques which were developed after extensive research by the United States Office of Education.

Dr. Carl Ahee, principal of Torrance High, told the group the audio-lingual approach uses the same methods and techniques used when a child learns English. Students are taught to listen to the language, then they learn to speak it, said Ahee. Final steps involve the teaching of reading and writing the language.

THE NEW METHOD involves repetition and class exercises designed to condition the ear to understand what is being said. Records, available to students for overnight use, and language laboratories are used to supplement class work.

A new state law requires all school districts to begin foreign language instruction in the sixth grade by 1965, said Dr. Ahee. The Torrance schools presently have Spanish instruction in the seventh grade in 30 elementary schools.

The program will be ready in 1965 through an in-service training program conducted through the University of California at Los Angeles extension program. More than 90 teachers have had a semester of the program, and three classes are currently being given to teachers.

MRS. ALBA MOESSER and Mrs. Gladys Kennedy, Torrance High Spanish instructors, conducted the demonstration with 10 students. The students participated in drills which they had seen, but not studied, and results were very good.

The program concluded with an audience participation song—in Spanish.

Board Names Low Bid on Storm Drain

Out of 15 contractor bids submitted for construction of the second unit of the South Torrance storm drain, the apparent low bid has been filed by N. A. Artukovich Contractors of Montebello, according to an announcement from the Board of Supervisors.

The Artukovich bid was \$812,874 with the high offering running \$1,052,362.

The project will involve installation of nearly three miles or reinforced concrete box and pipe conduits and includes two separate lines. Funds to finance the key drainage artery were included in the \$225 million bond issue approved by county voters in 1958.

One of the lines, beginning at Pacific Coast Highway and Hillworth Avenue will run north in Hillworth and Crenshaw Boulevard to 250th Street, turn east in 250th and extend to Pennsylvania Avenue and continue north in Pennsylvania to a junction with an existing drain at 248th Street.

The second line starts at the intersection of Main and 226th Streets and runs north in Main to 223rd Street, east in 223rd to Avalon Boulevard, north in Avalon to Carson Street, and east in Carson to the first unit of the project now under construction at Dominguez Channel, according to Supervisor Kenneth Hahn.

Work is due to start within two or three weeks after award of the contract and is slated for completion within about 10 months. District engineers will check all bids and recommend formal award of a contract to the Board of Supervisors in the next few days, according to Hahn.
