Warriors Vikings in Grid Titanic

El Camino College's unbeaten but once tied hogskinners face their most hectic battle of the season next Saturday evening when they clash head on with the powerful Vikings of Long Beach City College, in a fray which may go a long way in determining the Junior Rose Bowl nominee. The contest will be played on the Long Beach greensward at 8 p.m.

Camino suffered the first mar on a hitherto unblemished slate last Thursday night when they were tied by Modesto J. C. 0 to 0 in a sea of mud up north. Previously the Warriors had ground out six straight triumphs.

The Caminotes are by no means out of the bowl running, but with injuries to half backs "Dancing" Don Miller and Wayne Bird the Camino ground attack is very thin. One consolation for coach Schindler is that Ron Skrifoff will return to action. Avyery Smith, Gary Van Vleet, Dick Turner, and Skrifoff will carry the brunt of the ground attack, and Paul Held and Don Young will fill the air with passes if the running plays fail to produce.

Chief hope for victory will hinge on the performance of the great El Camio line. Coached by Norm Verry, Messers. Jurk, Cortrite, Wright, Barton, Donges, Hooks, Olsen, Olen and Wear have allowed six foes an average of only 4.23 points per contest.

H. S. Teachers Elect Salary Committee

Centinela Valley Secondary Teacher Association held a meeting at Leuzinger High School on Friday, with President Lewis E. Peters in charge.

Salary committee members were elected. Lowell Brubaker will represent Leuzinger for a three-year term and Bill Worthington will represent Inglewood High School for a similar one. A. John Waldmann was elected as administrator representative.

According to a report by Miss Ida Deppman, the salary committee will meet during the year with the president of the P.T.A.'s, the superintendent, and the Board of Trustees.

Election committee members were Miss Bernice Gange, T. W. Cochran, and Stuart Skeele. Norman Arnt gave a report on the camp Seeley meeting and Mrs. Ruth Beebe read the treasurer's report. It was decided to have three meetings of the salary committee during the year.

Dr. Heisner Warns Of Proposition No. 1

H. Fred Heisner, Superintendent of Centinela Valley Union High School District, announced that the district will lose \$104,235.00 or 12.37 per cent of the income from local tax sources for general maintenance and operation of the district, if Proposition No. 1 passes at the November 7th election.

These figures are based on data prepared by C. C. Trillingham, Los Angeles County Superintendent of Schools, and B. A. Betts, Assistant Superintendent in Charge of Finance, and which reveal that the total county loss to school districts will exceed \$12,000,000.

Personal property in Centinela Valley Union High School District is assessed at \$13,384,070.00 or 12.3 per cent of the total assessed valuation. This much of the base of the public school system's revenue would be wiped out by passage of Proposition No. 1.


Reserve Officer Notice
