

First Methodist Services to Honor Mothers

The Morning Worship Service at the First Methodist Church of Torrance on Sunday will give recognition to two special days, the modern observance of Mother's Day and the commemoration of the historic Day of Pentecost.

In the observance of Mother's Day appropriate recognition to motherhood will be given with special musical numbers by the choir. The minister, Rev. Clarence E. Miller will preach on the theme: "A Good Mother-in-law".

In commemoration of the historic day of Pentecost the local Methodist Church will join with Methodist Churches throughout Southern California and Arizona in making Pentecost Sunday a day for the ingathering of new members, with the goal 3000 souls which was the number received on that first Day of Pentecost after Peter had preached his great sermon in the upper room in Jerusalem.

A nursery for the care of infants and young children is provided during the church service. Church school for all ages begins at 9:30 a.m.

At 7 p.m. the Methodist Youth Fellowship is sponsoring a family night service for the whole church with three color motion pictures of beauty and inspiration which the whole family will enjoy.

B and G Flight School Now at Torrance Field

Now using the Torrance Municipal Airport as its base of operations is the B and G Air Service and Flight School. The air flight school, which gives its trainees complete air and ground training, was among the facilities moved to the Torrance field by E. G. "Slim" Kidwell from Central Airport in Compton.

Owned by Cliff Bantell and Mark Gates, the school teaches all courses in private, commercial, instructor, multi-engine and instrument training.

Manager of the school is Otho Ware, with veteran flyer, John Overall, chief pilot and instructor.

Overall, who has been flying since 1932, served in World War I as pilot and instructor. He also operates a Brokerage Sales company, which he moved from Compton to the Torrance airport.

At the disposal of all students of the B and G Air Flight School are seven planes, which include an Aerocess, Luscomb, Swift, Stinson and Twin-engine Cessna. Also included in their training equipment is a Link Trainer.

The twenty students now under the able instructorship of the B and G School, will continue their training at the Torrance field, announced Ware.
