Garden Glamour Featured by Pomona Fair Planning Chiefs

Exhibitors of agricultural products, livestock, women's work, fine arts, arts and crafts and junior fair products at the 24th annual Los Angeles County Fair in Pomona, Sept. 14 through Sept. 30, will receive a record total of \$171,681 in cash awards.

This was announced today by President-Manager C. B. Afflerbaugh following a last minute check of some 6000 competitive contests to be staged in the 20 major divisions of the exposition. Planning chiefs say garden glamour will be featured.

The lion's share of the prize money will go to exhibitors in the agricultural section which includes the floriculture and apiary divisions. Next in line is the livestock department with \$62,988. Women will collect \$8106 for their prize efforts with the needle and in the kitchen.

Palos Verdes Philharmonic Benefit Horse Show Saturday

With two months of preparation and planning behind them, more than 40 Palos Verdes Peninsula residents today were working out last-minute refinements for the first annual Los Angeles Philharmonic Benefit Horse Show being presented this Saturday, August 25, at the Portuguese Bend Riding Club.

Approximately 200 entries have been received for the 16-event horse show which will feature junior riders. Acceptances to the Friday evening invitation fund-raising box social supper that will precede the show have passed the 50-couple goal. The boxes will be auctioned off to high bidders. Reservations for the open-pit barbecue on Saturday evening following the show indicate a sell-out crowd, according to Mrs. Nicholas Trutanich, chairman of social events for the unusual benefit event.

\$1,500 PREDICTED
Fritz Lakin, over-all chairman, predicted that the Peninsula Committee of the Southern California Symphony Association of \$1,500 for the Philharmonic.

Ring and party decorations will feature the pictorial theme of the Philharmonic show: a horse jumping over a bar of music. Mrs. Wallace Lebkicher, decorations chairman, and her committee will fashion the unusual symbol out of flowers. It will be the main decoration at the ring entrance. Wood shaving walkways, hanging flower boxes, potted plants and cut flowers will be used to decorate the ring, the Portuguese Bend Riding Club courtyard, where both the box social and the open-pit barbecue will be held, and the concession booths.

Peninsula residents, who have joined together to stage the event where horses will perform in behalf of, rather than to the tunes of, musicians, are giving a number of cocktail parties before and after the charity show.

Jesse Powers, in charge of ring events, said that entries have been received from throughout Southern California with the Palos Verdes Peninsula, Olang Beach, San Fernando Valley and the Beverly Hills-Culver City areas providing a major share of the competitors.
