

Organizational Service of Walteria Community Methodist Church Set

Plans have been formulated for the official organization of The Walteria Community Methodist Church on Sunday, September 23rd at 7 p.m. The organizational service will be in charge of The Rev. Mr. Clarence E. Miller, minister of The First Methodist Church of Torrance, which church is sponsoring the new organization.

Rev. Miller will be assisted by his wife who has been speaking each Sunday morning at 10:30. This service and all other services of the church will be held in the clubhouse at the Walteria Park, which is the temporary meeting place of this new organization.

The first service of the Walteria Community Methodist Church was held on Easter of this year. The next Sunday a Sunday School was organized with Tom Kirk as superintendent. Preaching services have been held regularly each Sunday morning at 10:30 following the Sunday School classes. Attendance at the Sunday School, which has classes for all ages of children, youth and adults, has continually increased.

YOUTH FELLOWSHIP

Several weeks ago a Methodist Youth Fellowship was organized, meeting in the evening at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Cramer, 24240 Los Cadenas Ave. Under the leadership of Mr. and Mrs. Cramer, this organization immediately received the response of the youth of the community and an attendance of 30 was reported last Sunday evening.

J. A. Beasley has been elected as lay leader in charge of making plans for the organization. He reports that plans for the next few Sundays are as follows: Sept. 16, baptisms of infants and small children; and on Sept. 23 baptisms of youth and adults at the 10:30 a.m. service.

ORGANIZATION SERVICE

In the evening at 7 on September 23 the formal service of organization will be held with Rev. C. E. Miller of the First Methodist Church of Torrance in charge.

Charter members will be received and officers and committees will be elected, followed by a social fellowship hour.

The organization of this new church has been authorized, and the territory has been allocated to the Methodist Church by the Southern California Council of Protestant Churches to serve the spiritual needs of the residents of Walteria and Pacific Hills who are members and constituents of the major church denominations who cooperate together in the Council of Churches.
