

F. Selover Named to Republican Committee

The 68th Assembly District will have its full complement on the Republican County Central Committee as a result of the election by write-in votes of Barbara S. Bell, San Pedro; Frank S. Selover, Torrance, and Dwayne O. Larson, Wilmington, at the June 3 state primary, it was announced Tuesday night at the meeting of the 68th District Republican Assembly held in Smith Bros. Fish Shanty, on Pacific Coast highway, Torrance.

The 68th District is entitled to seven seats on the Central Committee, but only four filed. They were elected, and are: Mrs. Jean W. Haley, San Pedro; Clifton A. Hix, San Pedro; Lloyd A. Menveg, Wilmington, and Stephen M. Cope, Wilmington. They were incumbents on the ballot.

Mrs. Bell is prominent in Republican and women's activities in San Pedro. Selover, executive secretary of the Harbor Area Employers' Council, is organizer of the Torrance Republican Club, out of which grew the reorganization of the 68th District Republican Assembly.

Larson is one of the owners of Wilmington Hardware Co., and has been an active Republican worker in that community for years.

Robert H. (Bob) Finch, Republican candidate for Congress from the 17th Congressional District, was guest speaker at the Republican Assembly meeting Tuesday night. He thanked the group for their support declaring that his nomination over Rep. Cecil King, has been termed the June primary


Maybe, on occasion, anger or impatience, or even just inattention has gotten the better of you, too, and you have showed one or two of the bad driving habits these creatures symbolize.
