

The Chief said, it took three hours of one police officer's time to fulfill a routine previously handled in the local court in 15 to 30 minutes. In addition, a police car, badly needed here to provide adequate protection to Torrance citizens was out of action. It was parked near a court in Redondo Beach. When there are more than two police cars to be transported, two police cars and two or more officers will be required to take the cases to the Bay city.

To circumvent the loss of excessive number of man hours from the already inadequate police force, we will be compelled to invest about \$3,000 in a paddy wagon, to transport the prisoners, Stroh pointed out.

Solution Offered
The most feasible solution to the tremendous problem confronting local law enforcement officers would be a third judge to ride circuit throughout the South Bay Municipal Court District.

Sixty per cent of the additional work and money that will be incurred under the new plan would be eliminated if a traveling judge could hold court in Torrance for only one day per week, Stroh stated.

He indicated that police chiefs from other local communities agreed completely that this is the best answer to the bottleneck that will result when the switch is made in January.
