**Baked Fillets of Halibut**  
 6 individual servings of halibut  
 2 tablespoons butter  
 1 medium-sized onion  
 2 cups canned tomato soup  
 3-4 cup chopped olives  
 3-4 teaspoon salt, pepper.

Brown the fillets of halibut in the butter, that has been melted. Peel the onion and cut into thin slices. Arrange them in a baking dish and place the fish fillets on top. Pour over the tomato soup to which olives have been added. Season with salt and pepper. Bake 30 to 25 minutes in an oven 400 degrees.

**Smoked Salmon with Eggs**  
 1-4 lb smoked salmon, sliced  
 4 tablespoons margarine  
 4 to 6 eggs  
 2 tablespoons tomato juice  
 1-8 teaspoon curry powder  
 1-2 teaspoon salt  
 1 tablespoon minced parsley

Brown the salmon delicately in the margarine melted in a heavy frying pan. Mix together remaining ingredients, pour over salmon. Stir slowly over low heat until thickened as desired.
