Boy Drowns Unnoticed at Alondra Pool

There are now 13 life-guards at the Alondra Park swimming pool, with one guard having been added as a result of last week's tragic drowning of a Redondo Beach boy. The age requirement has also been raised to seven for using certain parts of the pool.

Graveside funeral services were held Saturday at Holy Cross Cemetery for a 6-year-old boy who drowned in the swimming pool last Thursday while 500 other boys and girls swam and splashed, quite unaware of the boy's danger.

The boy, Joseph Guerrero, was recovered from the water three and a half feet deep, and an hour long resuscitation effort proved to no avail.

The boy's body was discovered when a youngster told Life Guard Ralph Weyland that "somebody's lying on the bottom of the pool."

Young Guerrero went to the pool with two older brothers, and was swimming apart from them when the accident occurred. None of the many children swimming in the pool at the time noticed that he was in trouble.

It was the first drowning in the three-year history of the Alondra Park pool.


