

### BARBER SHOPS TO BE OPEN

At a meeting of Local 881 on September 28, the members voted Armistice Day off their holiday closing list. According to G. J. Berger, secretary-treasurer of the local, all union barber shops in Torrance and vicinity will open as usual on Armistice Day.

"In fact," Anderson continued, "No expense has been spared to make Tor Roller Drome a tops in its field. We have affiliated with RSDOA, Roller Skate Operators' Association," Anderson stated, "which makes it possible for our skaters to start participating in nationwide competition."

"And," beamed the genial operator, "To insure us some winners in those competitions, we've hired a very capable teacher, skating professional Frank Brassell. Class lessons, beginner and intermediate, will start almost immediately."
