'Shoeless' Shumaker Wins Fight

Walter (Shoeless) Shumaker, 73, was granted a Los Angeles Superior Court judgment declaring his Mexican marriage ceremony with 72-year-old Edith Mae Foster invalid, according to Robert E. Heggen, Shumaker's attorney. The action ends a lengthy legal battle which Shumaker, who often went barefooted around town, had with the woman who claimed to be his wife. The court also issued a writ of mandate empowering the sheriff to carry out a writ of execution for the sale of Shumaker's home at 1605 Elm avenue.

Claim Removed
A homestead claim placed on the Elm avenue house by Mrs. Foster was removed because the court declared it fraudulent since she alleged to be the wife when filing for the homestead. Mrs. Foster still is living in the house but will be evicted as soon as possible after the sale of her half of the house March 22, Heggen said.

Joint Tenancy
She acquired joint tenancy of the house and control of all Shumaker's four bank accounts after an alleged illegal marriage September 19, 1951, in Tijuana, the attorney said. The lengthy suit by Shumaker was to recover his money and possession of the house. The writ of execution to sell her half of the house came after a judgment was awarded for Shumaker in April for recovery of the funds. The sale of her share of the house was to bring funds to satisfy the judgment.




