two motions suspending the two inspectors. The motions were seconded by Councilman Albert Isen and passed by the rest of the council. Councilman Victor E. Benstead was not present on account of illness.

**New Post**

In order to correct past shortcomings of the building department, the new classification of superintendent of building was established and authorization granted to call for a civil service examination. No residence restriction was made. The starting salary will be \$600 to \$650. The superintendent will be in charge of the whole building department.

Criticism over the reinstatement of the building inspectors was voiced by John F. Baxter, area supervisor for the State Division of Housing.

"I think the Civil Service board concurred with our findings," Baxter said, referring to the State investigation which uncovered numerous building violations and faulty inspections. "It seems inconsistent if the board agrees with us that it would put the same men back on the job. If they are not qualified, why put them back?"

**Board Findings**

The board findings were stated as follows:

"The members of the Civil Service board... are in agreement that conditions exist in the building department which need correcting and have reached the following conclusions:

"1) It was very obvious to this board that the building inspectors have not been given sufficient instructions to properly perform their duties.

"2) That the chief building inspector, James S. Dresser, was not thoroughly familiar with the requirements of the Uniform Building Code. Baxter declared that the state investigation was made to accomplish two things: 1) avoid repetition of these violations and 2) correct the present construction faults. The city has failed in regard to the first point, Baxter said, by reinstating the inspectors in the same position. The second point is being accomplished, he thought, through the city's suit against the Princeton Construction Co. If each of the 20 charges against the Crenshaw Gardens contractor is upheld in court, the builder can be fined a total of \$6000 or be given the alternative to correct the alleged construction faults.
